

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Office of Public Safety - Campus Police Emergency dial 9-1-1 Non-Emergency x3067 or dial 246-0116

QUICK REFERENCE

Never assume someone has already called the authorities.

FIRE SAFETY

- * Activate the nearest fire alarm pull station.
- * If possible, dial 911 first. Then Call Campus Police at x3067 or dial 246-0116.
- * If possible, notify occupants and provide assistance as you are able.
- * Evacuate the building via the nearest safe exit.
- * Follow the directions of Campus Police and Evacuation Marshals.
- * DO NOT use elevators.
- * DO NOT re-enter the building until authorized to do so

BOMB THREAT

- * Remain calm.
- * Write down as much information as possible from the threatening caller.
- * Dial 911. The 911 Dispatcher will dispatch Campus Police and other necessary authorities.
- * Follow the instructions from emergency personnel.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

- * Dial 911. Notify the 911 Dispatcher of your location, building and floor, and the name and condition of the patient.
- * Remain on the phone with the dispatcher until help arrives.

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL SPILLS/RELEASE

- * Call Campus Police at x3067 or dial 246-0116 immediately.
- * Move away from the site of the hazard to a safe location.
- * Stay upwind of the material if possible.
- * Alert others to stay clear of the area.
- * Notify emergency personnel if you have been exposed.

GAS LEAKS, FUMES, VAPORS

If you detect natural gas, fumes or vapors:

- * DO NOT pull fire alarm.
- * DO NOT touch light switches or electrical equipment.
- * Call x3067 or dial 246-0116 immediately.
- * Follow directions of emergency personnel.

SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR/PERSON OF CONCERN

- * DO NOT physically confront the person exhibiting the behavior.
- * DO NOT let anyone into a locked room or building.
- * DO NOT block a person's access to an exit.
- * Call Campus Police at x3067 or dial 246-0116 immediately.

SUSPICIOUS PACKAGE/OBJECT

- * DO NOT touch or disturb the object.
- * Evacuate the area immediately.
- * Call Campus Police at x3067 or dial 246-0116 immediately.

BUILDING EVACUATION PROCEDURES

- * Evacuate the building as quickly as possible using the nearest exit (or alternate in nearest exit is blocked).
- * DO NOT use elevators.
- * Take personal belongings (keys, purses/wallet, ID, etc.) and dress appropriately for the weather.
- * Close doors as you exit.
- * Follow direction of emergency personnel.

ACTIVE SHOOTER/VIOLENT PERSON

If possible, exit the building immediately and dial 911. The 911 Dispatcher will dispatch Campus Police and other authorities.

- If you cannot safely exit the building, barricade yourself and others in a locked room when possible. Stay low and away from windows.
- Remain calm and quietly dial 911. The 911 Dispatcher will dispatch Campus Police and other authorities. Never assume someone has already called the authorities.
- 3. DO NOT attempt to confront or apprehend the shooter.
- 4. DO NOT leave or unlock the door to see what is happening.
- Stay where you are unless emergency personnel give instructions to exit. You may be asked to take shelter-inplace.

SHELTER-IN-PLACE

Upon the recommendation of public safety officials, or when there is a significant security concern, the safest course of action may be to shelter-in-place. Stay as calm as possible and follow these procedures:

- 1. First, ensure your own safety.
 - a. Move to the nearest location that can be secured by
 - b. If a locked door is not available, move as far away from the threat as possible.
 - Remain quiet and do not do anything that will draw attention to you.
- 2. Notify Campus Police
 - a. Campus Phone: x3067 or dial 246-0116
- 3. Assis others if possible
 - a. Allow other trusted individuals into your secure location.
 - b. Instruct them to stay calm and quiet.
 - c. If you know where the intruder (or source of the security threat) is, contact Campus Police immediately.
- When the security threat is over, Campus Police will
 move through the entire building and notify everyone
 that the threat is gone.

WEATHER EMERGENCIES

- 1. If possible, check the College website and monitor local television and radio stations for announcements.
- 2. Determine where you will take shelter if instructed to do so.
 - * Basements provide the best protection.
 - * If underground shelter is not available (or not advisable due to the situation), go to an interior room, or hallway on the lowest floor possible.
 - * Stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls. Go to the center of the room. Stay away from corners because they attract debris.
- 3. Stay in the shelter location until the danger has passed.
- You may be instructed to drop and cover under a table or desk or against an inside wall –NOT in a doorway

POWER OUTAGE

- * Remain calm.
- * Move cautiously to a lighted area.
- * Follow instructions of emergency personnel.
